SPORTS NEWS: Minnesota's only women's senior slow-pitch softball team recently won the bronze medal in the National Senior Games in Cleveland. Most of the 13 players are in the 65- to 66-year-old range. The team, which plays in West St. Paul, is named "the Tennis Team" because many of the players met through tennis.

Among players is pitcher **Jo Rolling**, 71, daughter of late Minnesota Softball Hall of Fame pitching legend **Johnny Vollmer**. Rolling also is a Hall of Fame member.

"I'm driven, and I'm competitive; I'm sure I inherited that from my dad," Rolling said. "I'm not a couch potato. At night, I have my martini. Life is good."

By the way, as announced two years ago, the National Senior Games -- featuring an assortment of sports for ages 50 and older -- will be held in the Twin Cities for the first time in 2015.
